- worked with local artisans to commission coasters, crocks, note cards, and other locally sourced, Furnace-themed items
- pulled off our second annual Traditional Village Christmas, expanding operations to the Stone House across the street and Harriet Chapel for the day
- participated in the Museums by Candlelight program, opening the Collier's Log House to visitors from all over Maryland
- secured funding and finalized plans (now underway) to replace the current roof on the Collier's Log House with a standing-seam tin roof
