JOHNSON FAMILY

Eleanor Murdoch Johnson

The first mention of the Johnson family, from whom we are descended, is found in Swinden, which, briefly abstracted, is: WILLIAM JANSEN? an engineer who was brought to Yarmouth, England, during 1568, from Holland, to supervise some engineering work at that town. With him came thirty other Dutchmen, who, on February 5, 1574 were bound to the town that they should be self-supporting and not become a charge. In the absence of other evidence we have assumed that James Johnson was a son of this William Jansen.

★ JAMES JOHNSON

Represented Great Yarmouth in the Parliament of 1585; was Commander of one of the ships of Great Yarmouth under Lord Howard of Effingham in the fight with the Great Armada in 1589; bailiff and alderman of Great Yarmouth in 1589 & 1590. Bailiffs were the principal men of the Burgh during their administration. He married and had James Johnson.

★ James Johnson.

Alderman and four times Bailiff of Yarmouth. He married and had Thomas Johnson of Yarmouth.

★ THOMAS JOHNSON.

Was Bailiff of Great Yarmouth in 1624, 1635, 1636 & 1644, a member of Parliament 1625 to 1644, a member of the Eastern Counties Committees in 1644 & 1649; was appointed in 1647 by Earl of Manchester the Parliamentary General, Commander of the Militia of Great Yarmouth; was Captain of a troop of cavalry in Cromwell's regiment in 1649; created Baronet in 1650 as Sir Thomas Johnson of Walwich, Somersetshire, England. Had a confirmation from Sir Edward Walker, dated 10 Dec. 1660; married Margaret, a daughter of Thomas Thompson, Bailiff of Yarmouth in 1614 & 1623, and had;

1. Thomas Johnson of Yarmouth/ married Elizabeth Leming.
2. James Johnson, of Yarmouth.

The first son married Elizabeth Leming, a daughter of John Leming of London, England, and had; -

★ JAMES JOHNSON

The second son was born at Yarmouth; he was a merchant; was deputed by the corporation to entertain King Charles the Second, at his house in 1671 when His Majesty was on his progress to Norfolk. He then received the honor of knighthood; his arms are recorded in LeNeve's Knights, folio 152, in the College of Arms, London, England. Arms: Argent, a fess counter embattled between three lion's heads erased, gules, crowned d'or. Was town clerk and recorder; member of Parliament from Yarmouth February 24, 1681. Lived well, spent much and died poor. He married Dorothy, a daughter of Alderman Augustine Scottow, who was sometime Mayor of Norfolk, and had: -

1. James Johnson;
2. Thomas Johnson.

JAMES JOHNSON.

The first son was born at Yarmouth in 1650; was admitted July 3, 1664 a pensioner to the Bachelor's table of Conville and Caius College, Cambridge, England. He held a responsible position in the Office of Foreign Affairs during the reign of Queen Anne.

★ THOMAS JOHNSON

The second son was born at Yarmouth in 1656 and died in Calvert County, Maryland, in 1714. Admitted March 1671, at 15 yrs. of age as a pensioner to the Bachelor's table of Conville and Caius College, Cambridge, England. He was a lawyer in good repute in Poole, near Yarmouth. He eloped with Mary Baker, a daughter of Roger Baker. Mary Baker was a ward in Chancery and came to Maryland in one of her father's vessels. She married Thomas Johnson in Calvert County in April 1688. Returning to England after 1700 Thomas Johnson was captured by Spaniards and for a long time held a prisoner; He succeeded in making his escape in a Canadian vessel. From Canada he traveled on foot to Calvert County; arriving at his home he found his house had been burned and his farm devastated by Indians. He may have had other children but Thomas is the only one of whom we have record.

The will of Roger Baker is dated Aug. 15, 1698, recorded but not proven, of Wapping, Middlesex; Executor, brother-in-law Abraham Hughes, of Ockingham, Berks County. He divides his estate between his daughters, Honor and Mary, equally and provides; "In the event of the death of either daughter dying under age or before marriage survivor or heirs to inherit

the deceased's portion; should both die without issue, portion of the estate to pass to four young daughters of sister Mary Cleves and the residue of estate to child or children of brother John Baker."

★ THOMAS JOHNSON

The son of Thomas Johnson and Mary Baker, was born at the head of Saint Leonard's Creek in Calvert County, Maryland, Feb. 19, 1701/02; died April 12, 1777 at the residence of his son James at Bush Creek Forge, near Ijamsville, Frederick Co. Md. and was buried in the family burying ground in the farm of John W. Mackall on the north side of Saint Leonard's Creek (the burying ground and chief residence were at the mouth of St. Leonard's Creek where it empties into the Patuxent River); married by the Rev. Jonathan Kay, (rector of Christ Church Parish from 1715 to 1737,) March 13, 1725 to Dorcas Sedgewick, born Nov. 2, 1705, died Dec. 11, 1770, a daughter of Joshua Sedgewick and his wife Elizabeth of Maryland and Connecticut, and had twelve children.

The farm of Thomas Johnson was at the mouth of Saint Leonard's Creek, it was a beautiful place; the house occupied an eminence and commanded a view of the Patuxent River as far as Point Patience; the house was burned; only one small house was left where his son James Johnson carried on a bakery to supply ship biscuit to the vessels that lay in the Creek, during the War of 1812.

In 1747 Thomas Johnson obtained a patent from Lord Calvert to a tract of land of more than 17,000 acres; on this tract the Catoctin Iron Furnace was located where his sons Thomas and Baker were associated with him. At the furnace guns were cast for General Washington and used at Yorktown.

Thomas Johnson was a member of the Committee of Correspondence in Dec. 1774; a member of the Committee of Safety July 28, 1774 to August 14, 1775. He was a man of very strong mind, great purity of character and incorruptible integrity. His children were born on the farm, where they were raised and remained until they were ready to take their places in life

JOHNSON

Thomas Johnson, who came from England, married Mary Baker and had one son, Thomas. Thomas, son of Thomas and Mary Baker, was born Feb. 19, 1702, and died April 12, 1777. He was married to Dorcas Sedgewick March 30, 1725, by Rev. Jonathan Kay. Dorcas Sedgewick was born Nov. 2, 1705, and died Dec. 11, 1770. She was the daughter of Joshua and Elizabeth Sedgewick, of Calvert County, Maryland.
